ANHIX’s Summer Symposium and Golf Tournament was held at the Ranch Golf and Country Club on September 12, 2018 with 60 people in attendance.

The program began with Michael McDermott, a Project Manager at Alberta Health, providing an update on the Central Patient Attachment Registry (CPAR) project.

Michael discussed the importance of continuity of care and the very real benefits it produces including decreased utilization, decreased mortality and decreased costs. He spoke to how

continuity was being enabled by the implementation of patient panels and the central patient attachment registry. He described the process of paneling and the key behaviors needed to support it. He described the implementation progress being made and the dependencies that were required to achieve a successful implementation. He finished by identifying challenges that are being encountered as implementation proceeds.

Next up was Dr. Lawrence Richer, Professor, Department of Pediatrics, University of Alberta, Associate Dean, Clinical

Research and Director of the Northern Alberta Clinical Trials and Research Center (NACTRC).

Dr. Richer’s presentation was entitled "How AI, big data, and digital technology are disrupting clinical trials and drug development".

He discussed how clinical trials are necessary to drive the adoption of innovation (drug, device, process or other) but they are often slow and expensive. He then went on to describe how the application of AI, big data, and digital technology are

... are transforming the conduct of clinical trials. He also indicated that there were many positives regarding Alberta landscape thus providing significant opportunity for innovation.

The last to speak was Dr. Deborah James, Executive Director, Innovation, Faculty of Medicine & Dentistry, University of Alberta who provided an introduction to the UAlberta Precision Health Initiative. She described the University of Alberta Precision Health (PH) Signature Area, the overarching support and infrastructure that guided identified initiatives. She identified the key people involved and the many partner organizations (Alberta Health, AHS, Alberta Innovates etc.) and she then spoke to several PH initiatives including the real world evidence unit, the Alberta Real World Evidence Consortium and Alberta Public Labs/Translational Research Laboratory.
